UC Santa Barbara Doctoral Student Receives Emerging Scholar Award

Cameron Sublett, a doctoral student at the <u>Gevirtz Graduate School of Education</u> (GGSE), is the recipient of an Emerging Scholars Award from the <u>University of</u> <u>California Center – Sacramento</u> (UCCS). He was recognized for excellence in public policy research.
