The campus's annual campaign continues through March 8, with the theme "United for Education." For over 60 years, UC Santa Barbara has partnered with United Way to raise resources and mobilize volunteers to serve those most at risk in the local community. Last year the campus raised \$107, 407; this year's goal is \$110,000.

As the campaign's final fundraiser, The Club & Guest House will donate 10 percent of all lunch proceeds from March 4-8 to United Way.
